Did you know?

- The Caribbean region includes more than 7,000 islands, stretching from the Bahamas off the coast of Florida to Trinidad and Tobago off the coast of Venezuela, in the south. Of these islands, 13 are independent nations, while others are overseas dependencies or territories of countries including the U.S., U.K., France and the Netherlands.
- The Caribbean islands have a land area of 92,541 square miles, with an approximate population of 36 million. Their sizes range from the largest island, Cuba, which is larger than all the other islands combined, to the tiny islands of Saba and Anguilla.
- > Dunn's River Falls, cascading 600 feet into the Caribbean Sea, was featured in the James Bond Movie "Dr. No."
- Queen Juliana Bridge in Willemstad, Curacao is the highest bridge in the entire Caribbean at 185 feet.

2020 Census - Reminder

The 2020 Census is happening now! It is very important to complete your 2020 Census questionnaire and it is not too late.

To do so, please complete your form online, by phone, or by mail when your invitation to respond arrives, or to get started, visit my2020census.gov or for overall timeline and information.

Why do we need to participate in Census 2020?

- For an opportunity for everyone qualified in your household to be counted.
- It is quick and easy. The 2020 Census questionnaire will take about 10 minutes to complete.
- It is safe, secure, and confidential. Your information and privacy are protected.
- Your response helps to direct billions of dollars in federal funds to local

- communities for schools, roads, and other public services.
- Results from the 2020 Census will be used to determine the number of seats each state has in Congress, and your political representation at all levels of government.

Getting started:

- You must complete your questionnaire once you begin.
- If you leave the questionnaire and return later, you will have to start over.
- Do not use the web browser buttons (back, forward, or close browser).
- Use the buttons within the questionnaire to navigate.
- For best results, use the latest version of Chrome, Firefox, Internet Explorer, or Safari, Enable cookies.

Please note that if you are responding online, you must complete the census in one sitting, as you **do not** have the ability to save your progress.
